

### **Notes from the Nurse**

### Returning for the 2024-2025 School Year

Summertime is a great time to get immunization updates and sports physicals done. Call now for an appointment at your doctor's office, or clinic. Availability fills up fast.

<u>Immunizations</u>: Some can be done at the same place sports physicals are provided, but not all. Call ahead and ask if both can be provided together this summer.



6<sup>th</sup> Grade Students, as well as those who will be turning 11 or 12 before July 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 will need:

- (1) Tdap booster or similar depending on your pediatrician's recommendation
- (1) Meningococcal (MCV) dose

#### ALL K-8 Grade Students need:

• (1) Dose of Varicella (or Doctor's note confirming having contracted a case of the chicken pox). If your child's first dose was given at 13 years of age or older, they will need a 2<sup>nd</sup> one.

Those who are not up to date on immunizations can attend practice, but will not be able to play in games until caught up.

### **Dental Hygiene Team**

Tooth B.U.D.D.S. came to Elgin School last week. They are a dental hygiene educational team who traveled from Safford, AZ, to provide individualized classroom education to all of the grades. Their

program is funded through grants for rural communities. We were very lucky to have them come to Elgin, as they generally only cover Graham and Greenlee counties. They provided a free water bottle, toothbrush, and toothpaste to all students, along with discussions on how to properly care for teeth and gums. Hopefully, we can get them to come next year to provide dental screenings, dental cleanings, fluoride treatments, and sealants *free of charge* in our school setting next year. If you are interested, please let the school nurse know. Parental permission forms must be filled out for this service. They did a fantastic job!






## Elgin Eagle Athletics






### Farewell & Welcome

Milk is more than just a beverage; it's a powerhouse of essential nutrients crucial for growing bodies. From calcium and vitamin D to protein and potassium, milk offers a myriad of health benefits, supporting bone health, muscle function, and overall growth.

#### MEETING USDA STANDARDS

Our school breakfast and lunch programs adhere to the latest USDA guidelines when it comes to fluid milk. Current rules state that schools are required to offer only fat-free (unflavored or flavored) and low-fat (unflavored or flavored) milk options. This ensures that our students receive the nutritional benefits of milk without unnecessary added fats.

### ENCOURAGING MILK CONSUMPTION

Parents, we encourage you to reinforce the importance of milk consumption with your children, both at school and at home. Whether it's enjoying a glass of milk with dinner or incorporating milk into snacks, every sip contributes to their overall health and well-being.

### What About Milk Substitutes?

A common request we receive from parents revolves around milk substitutes such as lactose-free or nondairy milks (soy, rice, coconut, almond). For students with a disability such as a food allergy, we require a written medical statement from a licensed physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice nurse to make a substitution.

Requests based on taste preferences, religious, moral, or health concerns do not qualify as a disability. In these cases, we may offer lactose-free milk or non-dairy milk at our discretion that meets the USDA nutrition standards for milk substitutions.
